

Messiah Moments 3

January 18-22, 2021

ADONAI, the Father, relates to us through covenants, in Hebrew, *b'rit*<sup>1</sup>. Cutting a covenant, a blood covenant, refers to the cutting of animal parts such as God did when He made His covenant with Abraham in Genesis 15. That covenant was between Him and Abraham's descendants, the Jews. The Abrahamic Covenant is eternal and includes God's promise of the Land of Israel to the Jews.

The active blood covenant which determines spiritual relationship between God and man today is the *B'rit Chadasha*, the New Covenant. Promised in Jeremiah 31, it was cut through the shedding of Yeshua's blood and death on the cross thus activating the New Covenant. And, it provides eternal atonement or salvation.

Up until that time, limited year to year atonement had been provided through the Mosaic Covenant. Also a blood covenant, its blood sacrifice was an animal. It was mediated by the *Kohen Gadol*, Israel's High Priest, who offered the sacrifice on *Yom Kippur*, the Day of Atonement. Today, even though the commands to perform it remain in Scripture, atonement through the Mosaic Covenant is inactive

since there is neither a Levitical priesthood nor a temple in which to provide it.

The blood of a sacrifice was what God demanded to cover sin. Leviticus 17 says: 11 "For the life of the creature is in the blood, and I have given it to you on the altar to make atonement for your lives—for it is the blood that makes atonement because of the life" (Leviticus 17:11 TLV). God cannot look upon sin and the blood of a sacrifice covers it. The New Covenant is an eternal covenant mediated by Yeshua, who is not only the sacrifice, but also the officiating priest. Not being from the Tribe of Levi, the tribe of Aaron, Yeshua could not be a priest. But, as Kohen Gadol, the Mediator and High Priest of the New Covenant after the order of Malkitzedek, His priesthood is not on earth, but in heaven.

Because of Yeshua's death at Passover time, we most often think of Him as our Passover lamb. And He is. John said of Yeshua: 29 ...., "Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29b TLV)! But, Yeshua also fulfilled Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement. The writer of Hebrews describes the Day of Atonement service and then says this: 11 "But when Messiah appeared as Kohen Gadol of the good things that have now come, passing through the greater and more perfect Tent not made with hands (that is to say not of this creation), 12 He entered into the Holies once for all—

not by the blood of goats and calves but by His own blood, having obtained eternal redemption" (Hebrews 9:11-12 TLV). Yeshua took His own blood into the Holy of Holies in the Tabernacle in heaven and fulfilled *Yom Kippur*, the Day of Atonement for us. But, not just for one year as in the Mosaic Covenant, but eternally.

Each of us who has trusted in our Messiah is a covenant member of the B'rit Chadasha, the New Covenant. But, we also become members of Israel, God's covenant nation. Jeremiah 31 says: 30 "Behold, days are coming"—it is a declaration of Adonai— "when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah" (Jeremiah 31:30 TLV). How do we Gentiles become a part of Israel? We do it by trusting in Yeshua. Sha'ul, Paul, explains this for us in Ephesians 2: 11 "Therefore, keep in mind that once you—Gentiles in the flesh—were called "uncircumcision" by those called "circumcision" (which is performed on flesh by hand). 12 At that time you were separate from Messiah, excluded from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. 13 But now in Messiah Yeshua, you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of the Messiah" (Ephesians 2:11-12 TLV). God's Israel is a commonwealth, a nation made up of Gentiles who have trusted Yeshua, Jews who have trusted

Yeshua, and all Jews as members of the Abrahamic Covenant. When we speak of Judeo-Christianity, we are speaking of this special group which God has put together as the Commonwealth of Israel. We Gentiles have been grafted into Israel, a part of God's eternal plan which *Sha'ul* in Ephesians 3 calls "the mystery of the Gospel:" 6 "This mystery is that the Gentiles are joint heirs and fellow members of the same body and co-sharers of the promise in Messiah Yeshua through the Good News" (Ephesians 3:6 TLV).

י B'rit, covenant, is a transliteration from the Hebrew בְּרִית. The pronunciation b'rit, is Sephardic, the method of transliteration from the Hebrew used in Israel, Spain and Latin America. New Covenant is אַרִית חֲדָשָׁה, B'rit Chadasha. The eastern European Jews are known as Ashkenazi and they use a different transliteration. Their pronunciation of the Hebrew, בְּרִית, is bris. Sabbath in Sephardic pronunciation is bris. Sabbath in Sephardic pronunciation is bris. In Ashkenazi, it is bris. Because of the re-establishment of the Nation of Israel, the Sephardic pronunciation has come into much greater use, even in some Ashkenazi congregations. Most, if not all Messianic

Jewish congregations use the Sephardic pronunciation.
